Does Djibouti have a strong economy?

Despite its strategic position, Djibouti's economy remains vulnerable to external shocks and regional tensions, which impact growth prospects. The government continues to focus on improving human capital, infrastructure, and economic diversification through strategic development initiatives.

Why is Djibouti struggling?

This comes after a decade of negative or low growth and is attributed to fiscal adjustment aimed at improving public financing, reforms in port management and foreign investment. Despite the recent modest and stable growth, Djibouti is faced with many economic challenges, particularly job creation and poverty reduction.

What are the policy actions in Djibouti?

The policy actions, as summarized in Table 5.1, include undertaking policy and institutional reforms and investments in basic infrastructure services such as ICT; water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH); and electricity to reduce production costs for firms and improve children's health and nutritional status.

Why does Djibouti have a low employment rate?

Djibouti has a low employment rate, employing only about a quarter of its working population (15 and older). This is mainly due to low labor force participation, especially by women. The low rate of labor participation may be due to a mismatch between labor market demands and labor skills.
